Help! It seems like everyone these days is talking about bullying but I'm still confused on what exactly it is. I am never sure if a situation is considered bullying or not. Could you please explain the difference between bullying and conflict?

Dear Baffled about Bullying,
You picked the perfect time to ask! I don't know if you know this but October is National Bully Prevention Month. This is definitely an important topic for all of us to talk about and we need to make sure we all understand what the definition is. A conflict is when two or more people of the same relative amount of power see the same situation from two different points of view. Usually with conflicts, everyone involved wants to see the issue be resolved. In order for a situation to be considered bullying, the behavior must be aggressive and include:

- **An imbalance of Power.** Bullies use their power to control or harm others. This imbalance of power can change though over time depending on the situation.
- **Repetition.** The behaviors/actions must happen more than once or have the potential to happen again.

Private Transportation

Our first Private Transportation days are October 9th and 12th. We wanted to send out the information now, so that you have time to make sure your child (or children) knows what to do! Each of the three homeroom teachers will be responsible for taking and watching your child in one of the three designated dismissal areas (front lot, back lot and Rectory). For example, Mrs. Jenny Lonneman will take all 3rd graders going to the Rectory, Miss Ramey will take all the 3rd graders going to the front lot and Mrs. Schulte will take all 3rd graders going to the back lot. When dismissal begins, there will be teachers directing traffic lines. Please make sure to stay in your car and a teacher will ask for your name and bring your child (or children) to you.

Front lot: All car riders and bus numbers 81, 40, 90

Back lot: CCH 2 & 3, 85, 50, 132

Rectory: 11, 58, 61, 127

If there is a change to your child's dismissal location, please email your child's homeroom teacher.
