- David's Drawings by Cathryn Falwell. "David's Drawings is a gentle celebration of a child's
  creativity that speaks directly to the experiences of children. This reassuring story is
  sure to provide comfort and encouragement as children face the challenge of making
  friends in new situations."
- I Like Myself by Karen Beaumont. "High on energy and imagination, this ode to selfesteem encourages kids to appreciate everything about themselves--inside and out. Messy hair? Beaver breath? So what! Here's a little girl who knows what really matters."


