Tricks for Testing Time

Dear Tricks for Testing Time,  
Your child maybe the one taking the test, but there are definitely things you can do as a parent to ensure that your child is performing their best. Here are some tips for you to help your child on the day of the test:

- **Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast.** Many teachers have reported that students who do not do well on tests did not get enough sleep or eat breakfast. If your child does both of these, they will be better able to perform their best.
- **Get to school on time. Don't let your child miss school.** Children tend to do better when they take the test with a group, rather than at the make up time. Unless your child is sick, make sure they have the opportunity to be at school and on time so they can take the test with the rest of their class.
- **Make each morning pleasant.** Try to make each morning as pleasant as possible. Don't engage in any unnecessary conflicts. This could add to your child's stress for the day and impact their performance on the test.
- **Remind your child the test is important.** You don't want to add more pressure onto your child, but you should remind them to try their hardest. Encourage your child the try their best. It even helps to go over the test with them at the end of each day. Ask them what they think they did well and what they wish they could have done differently. Going over testing strategies after the test can be just as beneficial as going over beforehand. These are skills students will always need for the future.

Congratulations also go out to **Trey Gronotte** who placed third in Science at the Diocesan Academic Showcase. Way to go!




### **The Wise Turtle: An Anthology of Seventh Grade Poetry**


