Counselor's Corner:

Dear Mrs. Clark.



I'm hoping you can help me. I have a fourth grader who has expressed to me that she does not want to leave her teacher after this school year. She says that she doesn't want to go to the fifth grade. I think she is scared and nervous about the transition. Do you have any suggestions on things I can do to help prepare her for next year?

Nervous About Next Year

Dear Nervous About Next Year,

I have found that there are a lot of students who become nervous at the end of the school year because they are concerned for what the next year will bring. I would take the time to reassure your student that this is perfectly normal and that she isn't the only one worried about the big "jump" upstairs. Here are a few suggestions to help your student feel confident about moving on to the next grade level, whether it be first grade, fifth grade or even high school:

- Discuss and work out a plan for the logistics of the change. Regardless if they are staying in the same building or going to a new one for high school, many children worry about if they will be able to find their new classroom or rooms on the first day. Many older students will also worry about remembering their class schedule. Take some time before the new year starts to talk to your child about a plan to help them figure out where they need to go. Make copies of their class schedule so they can tape one inside their planner, another inside their locker and an extra in case they lose the others. Also, take time to come up before school starts so your child can do a walk through and get a feel for their new routine. You can also see if their teacher is available for them to come in early and meet them one on one.
- Discuss any academic concerns your child has. Many students worry about the transition to the next grade level because they believe it is harder than their previous years. Take time this summer to talk to your child about strategies that will help ease their concerns. For example, work with them on time management skills or create an organizational system that works for them.
- Establish routines. This is especially true for students making the transition to high school. Your child may think that this new change means more freedom for them but unfortunately this might set them up for failure. Encourage your child to set up an after-school routine as soon as the year starts to ensure homework gets done and they stay organized.
- Don't end your involvement. Just change it. Your child is getting older and may not want you volunteering at their school as much. This doesn't mean you still can't show an interest in what they are doing at school. Take time to talk to your child about their day. This is something you can even start practicing on this summer. Talk to your child about what they are excited about when school starts again and what they are worried about. Show your child that you care about their transition to a new grade level just as much as they do.

Second Grade


